OUR TOP TIPS

As recommended by the Youth Guides of Youth Voice Canterbury:

- SUPPLY FOOD.
- MAKE IT FUN!
- GIVE US THE <u>WHOLE</u> STORY.
- USE OUR WORDS, DON'T TWIST THEM.
- HEAR <u>US</u>, NOT WHAT YOU WANT TO HEAR.
- TREAT US AS EQUALS.
- FEEDBACK TO US SO WE KNOW OUR TIME HAS BEEN WELL SPENT.

// WHICH LEVEL OF YOUTH ENGAGEMENT?

THE BEST RESULT FOR ALL

Youth participation theory (Westhorp's Continuum) helps us to make sure that the right level of engagement is adopted for every project we undertake to be consulted on. Which do you think would work best for what your project, idea, plan or consultation?



Ad hoc

Create a
good
environment
for young
people to

Structured consultation

Develop a deliberate strategy to seek young peoples' views on what they need, implying a two-way flow of information and ideas

Influence

Give young people some formal level of input to ensure at least a minimal level of influence on the organisation.

Delegation

Provide young people with real responsibility for undertaking particular tasks in the organisation, mutually understanding the level of reach involved.

Negotiation

Contribute your ideas alongside those of young people.
Information, perspectives and decisions are then reached by consensus and compromise.

Control

Offer young people the chance to make all or many of the crucial decisions within the organisation, from policy and programming to financial management and staffing.

SUCCESS STORIES

Here are some examples of work we've done with organisations:





- Todd Foundation had \$1 million in funding to give to a Christchurch Youth sector initiative, and Youth Voice Canterbury helped them decide the winning bid. Todd:
- Used Westhorp's youth participation continuum
- Developed a youth panel
- Reimbursed young people for time involved

YOUTHFUTURES CANTERBURY

Youth Futures Canterbury wanted to get a youth perspective on an employment framework document they were developing for employers and employees. This is how they worked with Youth Voice Canterbury:

- Met YVC and discussed best options
- Came to Youth Connect event and ran workshop
- Provided comprehensive feedback
